These changes are based on research on the anthropometrics of persons using manual wheelchairs, motorized wheelchairs, and scooters. This presentation will explain the reasons for these changes, and the effects they will have on the design of areas such as bathrooms and mercantile and dining spaces.

This presentation will explain the new accessibility criteria for diagonal and street parking, electric vehicle charging stations, bottle filling stations, enhanced classroom acoustics, sign language interpreters stations, and gaming machines and tables. The new edition also includes a new way to look at items such as curb cuts/blended transitions and service counters.
